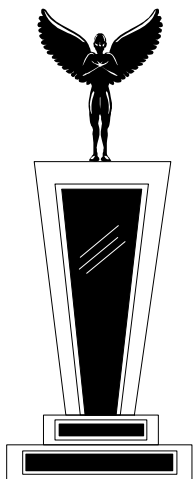


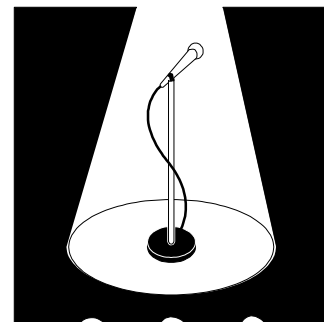
## THE BEST OF THE OHIO DISTRICT



A big part of convention is the contests. These include individual contests and club contests. These awards are given out Sunday morning at the K-Family Breakfast, which had the Disney theme this year. Some of the awards can be earned individually; others have to be earned through a club effort.

Here are the winners for those awards that took the whole club to earn. The first is the Single Service Project. The Gold winner was Copley High School, Silver was Gallia Academy High School and Bronze was Brunswick High School. The Video Contest can sometimes be made by an individual but it takes the whole club to create the video. This year the First Place winner was Westlake High School, the Second Place winner was Medina High School, and the Third Place winner was Gallia Academy. The K-Family Project First Place award goes to none other than Marietta High School and the Second Place award goes to Salem High School. The Service Project of the year was awarded to Marietta and the Second Place was given to Salem High School.

Those clubs that have filled out the Achievement Report have the chance to be awarded the Distinguished Club Patch. Only two clubs this year reached that goal, they were none other than Gallia Academy High School and Willoughby South High School. Two clubs also achieved the Distinguished Club Diamond Level; they were the Salem High School and Marietta High School. The Distinguished Club First Place Award went to Salem High School; Marietta came in Second Place and Third Place was Gallia Academy High School.



One of the most widely known contests is that of the Scrapbooks. There are two categories: Traditional Scrapbook and Non-Traditional Scrapbook. The Traditional Scrapbook First Place was taken by Gallia Academy High School, Second Place was taken by Willoughby South High School and Third Place was taken by Gallia Academy High School also. The Non-Traditional Scrapbook contest is always interesting; it often has several creative and unique scrapbooks entered. This year First Place went to the Suitcase Scrapbook of Salem High School, Second Place went to Westlake High School and Third Place went to Bay High School.

There are three main contests for individuals. The first is the Oratorical Contest; the contestants are given a topic or question in which they write a speech about. This year First Place winner was Christina Day from Copley High School; Second Place went to Mandy Singh from Mid Park High School. The Poster Contest is for those artistic members in Key Club who can create a poster. This year's First Place winner was Lyle Richards from Gallia Academy, Second Place was Li Cali from Bay Village High School and Third Place was Jessica Moser of Salem High School. One of the biggest individual contests is the Talent Contest. This year's first place winner was Chelsea Carpenter of Zanesville High School, Second Place was Ashley Duff of Indian Lake High School and Third Place was Rachel Lioe of Mayfield High School.

Each year there are several scholarships given out. This year the Michael Clancy Scholarship went to Anthony DePietro of Indian Lake High School. There were two \$250 scholarships, which were given to Jennifer Schlariett of Mt. Vernon High School and Douglas Shuey of West Muskingum High School. One of the two \$500 scholarships went to Mia Hall of Xenia High School and the other went to Curt Bradshaw of Clinton Massie High School. The \$1,000 scholarship went to Andy White of Mt. Vernon High School.
